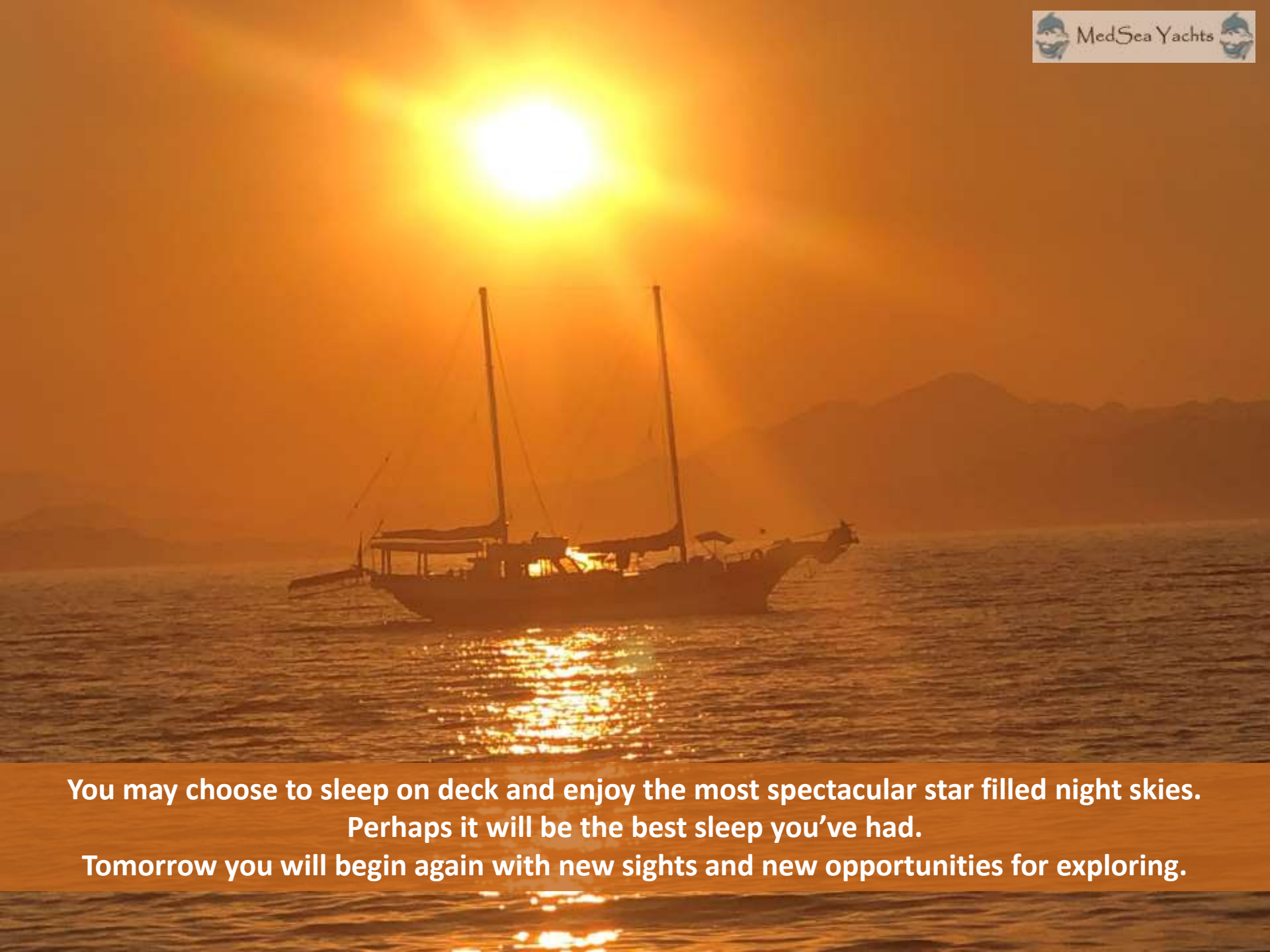

Loryma Bay

Located on the southern tip of the peninsula, this fascinating bay has been used for centuries for hiding fleets preparing for attacks on nearby islands. It is said to have been inhabited from as early as 3500 BC. The fortress wall is over 300 meters long, 36 meters wide and is as high as 6 meters in places.

Loryma is also known as Bozukkale or broken castle in English.

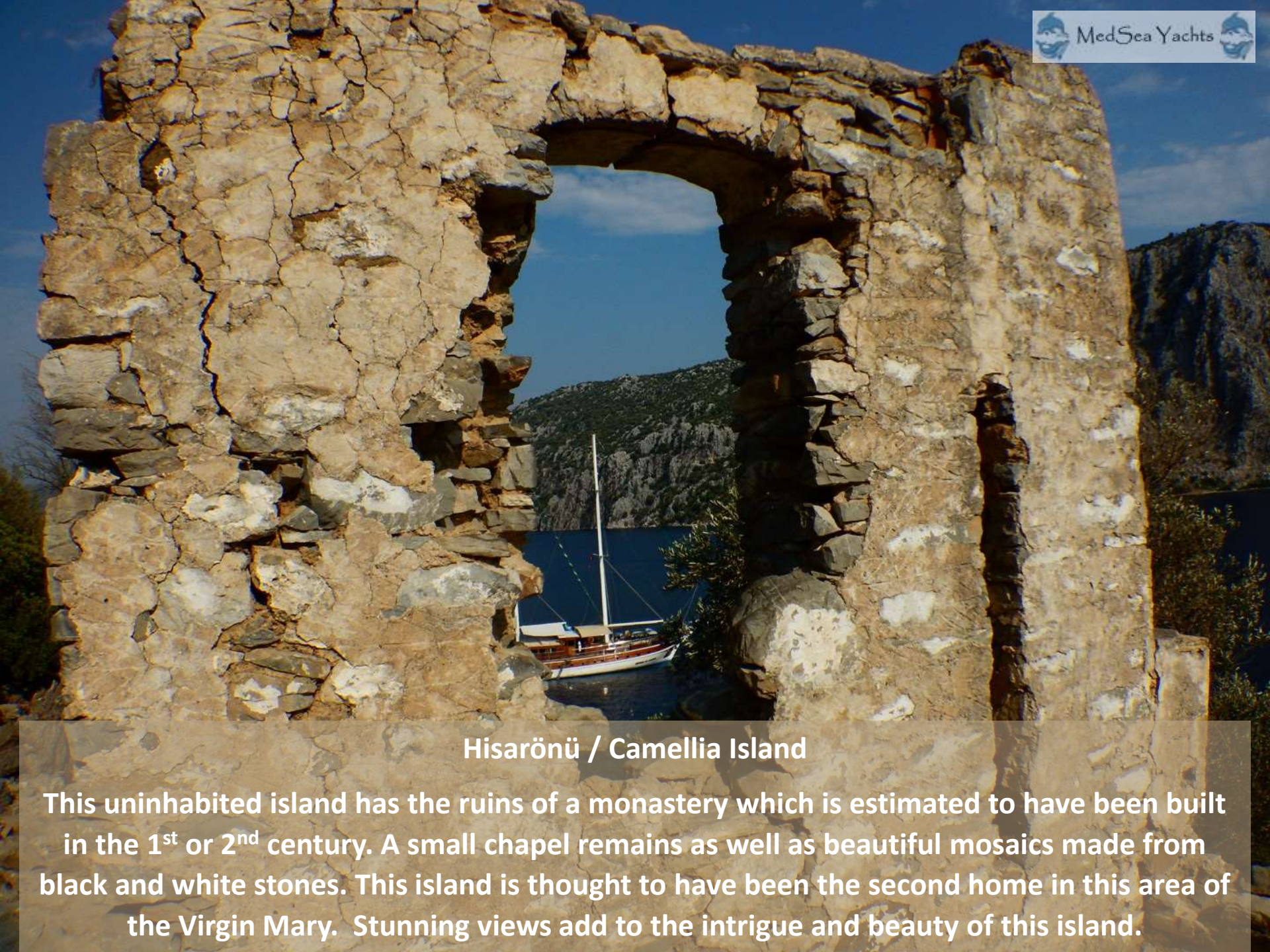
A moderate hike to the fortification will reward you with spectacular views. Walking along the wall you can also enjoy a fabulous sunset with Rhodes & Symi Greece in the distance.





Bozburun and Datça Peninsulas

The coastline between Datça and Bozburun is one of the most beautiful in the region with hundreds of bays ready to be explored. You will experience crystal clear seas in all shades of blue and turquoise. Turkish gulets are built in the Bozburun area by local craftsmen plus farming is important in this area, specifically almonds, honey & oregano.



Hisarönü / Camellia Island

This uninhabited island has the ruins of a monastery which is estimated to have been built in the 1st or 2nd century. A small chapel remains as well as beautiful mosaics made from black and white stones. This island is thought to have been the second home in this area of the Virgin Mary. Stunning views add to the intrigue and beauty of this island.



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
